

Wag Central Play Park and Fetch Lane Rules

- All dogs must be leashed when entering and leaving the park.
- All dogs must have a brief assessment prior to coming to play park.
- All dogs must be current on Rabies, DHPP, Leptospirosis, and Bordetella vaccines, as well as have proof of a negative fecal test within the last 6 months. They must be free of any parasites, ticks, and fleas.
- No females in the heat.
- Collars must be removed prior to entering park unless it's a break away collar.
- Dogs must be under voice control at all times.
- No dogs under 6 months (excluding puppy school or puppies in daycare).
- Prong, choker chains, and spiked collars must be removed before entering the park.
- No more than 3 dogs per adult.
- Play park scheduling will be done online, we reserve 45 min blocks of time. If you think you will be more than 10 minutes late then please schedule another appointment.
- Dogs must be supervised by an adult at all times. No talking on cell phones.
- No children under 16 years old in the play park.
- Owners must carry a leash on them at all times. In the event of a problem, owners should be able to quickly leash and remove their dog(s) from the park.
- Retractable leashes are prohibited at Wag.
- Owners are responsible for the behavior of their dog(s). Wag Central is not responsible for any injuries that may occur in the Play Park.
- Closed toe shoes are highly recommended. No heels in the play park.
- Hooks are provided for coats, purses, etc. We are not responsible for any lost or stolen items.
- Smoking is prohibited.
- No dogs exhibiting the following are allowed in the park: coughing, excessive sneezing, eye or nose discharge, diarrhea, vomiting, lethargy, etc.
- Owners are responsible for cleaning up pet waste inside the park and throwing it out in our trash can.
- Do not bring dog treats or human food into the park.
- Do not brush or groom your dog in the park.

- Do not bring toys from home--we have plenty of toys to choose from at the park.
- Glass containers and food bowls are not permitted in the park. However, there are plenty of shared water bowls available in the park.

I (we) understand that I am responsible for supervising my dog(s) and determining whether or not this is an appropriate activity for them. I (we) assume the full risk of any injuries, damage, or loss which you or your dogs might sustain as a result of participating at the play park. The risks may include, but are not limited to injury, or damage caused directly or indirectly as a result of dog fights, dog bites, scratches, being knocked down, chased or tripped.

If a guest is of the ages 16-18, the signature of a parent or guardian is required to bring his/her dog to the Wag park.

Children under the age of 16 are not allowed in the play park, daycare, self wash area or the pool area. Safety is our top priority at wag central and for insurance purposes we cannot be held responsible for any injuries. Dog parks are places where dogs naturally nip at each other, jump on each other, play fight, etc. This is an environment for dogs to socialize, burn off energy, and just have fun without the worry of knocking a child over. Children are the most common victims of dog bites and are more likely to be severely injured. Annie, the dog life specialist holds a class called kids club. The class educates children on proper dog etiquette and dog bite prevention.
